(cont.) PA misdemeanor and/or felony conviction(s)	Anyone who has a criminal record may apply for a pardon. There are no definite standards for when a pardon will be given. But the majority of people who receive pardons have a record of only one minor offense and it has been at least five years since the individual's completion of time on probation. The most common types of crimes to receive pardons include shoplifting and disorderly conduct. Typically, serious crimes are only pardoned if several decades have passed since the crime was committed. Although only misdemeanor and felony convictions may be considered in most instances of employment, the potential employer will probably still see the summary conviction (and possibly be influenced by it) if you don't get it expunged. If the expungement is not granted, appeals may be available. Note: Expungement does not necessarily remove the event record from Pa.
